Green Public Procurement Action Plan of Catalonia 2022-2025













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Background

Green public procurement has seen an increased potential as a tool for promoting public environmental protection policies, thus contributing to the achievement of the commitments of the National Plan for the implementation of the 2030 Agenda in Catalonia, especially Sustainable Development Goal 12 -. Responsible Consumption and Production. This is aimed at mitigating climate change and transitioning towards a circular economy and neutral in CO ₂ emissions.



Legislation and Framework for Green Public Procurement in Catalonia

In the same vein, Law 9/2017, of 8 November, on public sector contracts, includes measures that incentivise contracting with environmental criteria.

For years, the Generalitat de Catalunya has been working on the greening of public procurement. It approved the Generalitat Agreement, of 11 October 2005, which outlined measures to promote the greening of public procurement by the Administration of the Generalitat de Catalunya and its affiliated or related public entities and companies, establishing the Commission for Monitoring the Greening of Administrative Contracting (CSACA).

It also approved the Generalitat Agreement, of 9 December 2009, which introduced measures for public procurement,, including greening initiatives. Additionally, the Generalitat Agreement, of 20 June 2017, established a Code for Socially Responsible Public Procurement within the scope of the Administration of the Generalitat de Catalunya and the public sector under its jurisdiction.

Furthermore, to facilitate the application of environmental clauses, green procurement guidelines have been approved for products or service categories.

At the end of this section you will find a list of these guidelines along with those proposed by the European Commission.



In a sector-specific context, the greening of public procurement has been incorporated into the Generalitat Agreement of 16 June 2015 approving the Food Public Procurement Plan of Catalonia and Law 16/2017 of 1 August on Climate Change. It is also reflected in the Generalitat Agreement, of 3 January 2017, concerning the acquisition of low-emission vehicles and other aspects related to the environmental improvement of vehicle fleets. Other agreements, such as the Generalitat Agreement, of 4 December 2018, approving the Energy Savings and Efficiency Plan for buildings and equipment of the Generalitat de Catalunya, within the framework of Catalonia's energy transition, for the period 2018-2022, the Generalitat Agreement, of 11 June 2019, on the restriction of certain single-use plastic products in the Generalitat de Catalunya and the Generalitat Agreement, of 14 May 2019, declaring a climate emergency, have also incorporated aspects related to greening public procurement.

At the same time, the promotion of green public procurement has also been incorporated into strategic documents such as the Strategy for Promoting the Green and Circular Economy, approved by Generalitat Agreement of 26 May 2015, Catalan Eco-Design Strategy for a Circular and Eco-Innovative Economy, approved by Generalitat Agreement of 2 June 2015 and the Waste and Resource Prevention and Management Programme of Catalonia (PRECAT2013-2020).

According to the latest reports prepared by the General-Directorate of Public Procurement, during the period 2016-2020 there has been an upward trend in the greening of public procurement in the Generalitat de Catalunya, both in terms of the number of contracts and the total amount awarded.

Through Agreement GOV/55/2020, of 31 March, the objectives and minimum content of the Catalan Public Procurement Strategy were approved.

In this regard, in 2020, excluding contracts with emergency procedures, 9,382 contracts were awarded for an amount of €1,897 million. Of these awards, 3,744 incorporated environmental clauses in the terms that determined their award, amounting to a value of €935.9 million.

In the period 2018-2020, on average, awards that included environmental clauses accounted for 33.5% of the total awards, representing 40.6% of the total amount awarded.

APPROVAL OF THE GREEN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT ACTION PLAN OF CATALONIA

Given the context outlined and within the framework of meeting the objectives set by the Strategic Plan for the Improvement of Public Procurement, the Green Public Procurement Action Plan of Catalonia 2022-2025 was approved by the Generalitat Agreement of 22 March 2022. This plan aims to systematize and specify the actions that the Generalitat carries out in the field of greening public procurement.

European Commission Product Categories

The European Commission has developed criteria to facilitate the incorporation of environmental requirements into the procurement documents for supplies and services of the following:


Since 2008, the European Commission has developed green public procurement criteria for over 20 product categories. The Directives 2014/24/EU and 2014/23/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council, of 26 February 2014, on public procurement and the award of concession contracts, respectively, consolidate the possibilities of including environmental criteria in procurement, promoting the application of instruments such as -eco-certifications, and introducing new options, such as considering the life cycle cost of products and services.

The European Green Deal stipulates that public authorities must set an example and ensure that their procurement procedures meet ecological criteria, and that the Commission will propose legislation and guidelines on green public procurement. Within the framework of the European Green Deal, the Circular Economy Action Plan for the year 2020 states that the Commission will propose mandatory minimum criteria and objectives for green public procurement in sectoral legislation, require monitoring systems for greening, and support capacity-building through training and dissemination of best practices.

- Interior cleaning services (building cleaning, including cleaning products)

- Water-based heaters (max. power 400kW), excluding heaters for domestic hot water (DHW) in heat or cogeneration networks

1. Scope of application

Introduction

The Green Public Procurement Action Plan of Catalonia 2022-2025 (hereinafter referred to as the "Plan") is addressed to the departments of the Administration of the Generalitat de Catalunya, public universities and entities affiliated with the public sector.

Local government administrations and entities from the public sector can voluntarily join this Plan. The Directorate-General of Environmental Quality and Climate Change will be responsible for managing the voluntary adherence system through the adherence form (Annex).

The Directorate-General of Public Procurement and the Directorate-General of Environmental Quality and Climate Change will provide support and necessary guidance to local entities, public sector organisations or statutory institutions that have joined the Plan for its proper implementation.

2. Objectives

Introduction

The Strategic Plan for the Improvement of Public Procurement (hereinafter, the "Strategy") establishes, among its key pillars, the challenge of using public procurement to advance other public policies (Axis 3) and sets objectives for promoting environmentally sustainable procurement, integrating circular economy principles into public procurement, and raising awareness and providing training to public buyers in this regard.

To increase and enhance the green public procurement, the Strategy envisions various actions, including but not limited to:

Actions

- Assessing
- Reporting
- Greening
- Innovating
- Training
- Establishing agreements
- Collaborating






Actions

- Assessing the environmental measures needed for each contract.
- · Preparing reports analysing the results of the Green Procurement.
- Greening procurement and key services such as building maintenance, energy, furniture, public works and vehicles.
- Promoting the use of eco-labels in public procurement.
- Incorporating environmentalism into the Public Innovation Procurement.
- Providing specific training on Green Public Procurement.
- Developing and updating standards, government agreements, guides and other documents on Green Public Procurement.
- Collaborating with the relevant environmental authorities of the Generalitat to disseminate materials, conduct courses and organise seminars on Green Public Procurement.

Plan Objectives

- Identify lines of action and main actions to be taken in the field of green public procurement.
- Systematise the greening of public procurement, through the definition of a common methodology.
- Promote forums for exchange that facilitate collaborative work among all public sector entities in Catalonia and exchanges with other entities in the European Union to address and adapt to new regulatory requirements stemming from EU Directives.
- Establish synergies with different strategic public policies of Catalonia.
- Provide procurement authorities with the tools to systematically environmentalise public procurement through training programmes and the development of support resources.



3. Implementation and Monitoring of the Plan

Introduction

The responsibility for leading and promoting the implementation of the Plan falls to the Directorate-General of Public Procurement and the Directorate-General of Environmental Quality and Climate Change, with the following distribution of responsibilities and functions:



Directorate-General of Public Procurement:

In line with its competencies for developing the Strategy and for the supervision and regulation of public procurement by the Generalitat de Catalunya, public universities and its public sector, the Directorate-General of Public Procurement is responsible for the following actions:

Actions

- Promoting and monitoring the effective implementation of the Plan by the Administration of the Generalitat de Catalunya, the Public Universities and their affiliated public sector.
- Aligning the planned actions in the Plan with the objectives and actions outlined in the Strategy.
- Monitoring and evaluating data related to environmental clause indicators derived from the Plan.



Directorate-General of Environmental Quality and Climate Change

The responsibility for driving environmentalisation measures rests with the Directorate-General of Environmental Quality and Climate Change, specifically through the Environmental Qualification Service.

Actions

- Stimulating the practical implementation of the planned actions.
- Performing management functions as assigned by the Directorate-General of Public Procurement.
- Elevating to the Directorate-General of Public Procurement any issues that require its intervention.
- Promoting and managing the extension of the Plan to the local public sector.





Commission for the Environmentalisation of Administrative Procurement (CSACA)

Participate in Action 3 - Working Materials and in Action 4 - Development of Environmentalisation Criteria and Support Tools.

Additionally, to be able to monitor the impact of the Plan on an annual basis, as well as the degree of compliance with certain actions provided for in it, a series of indicators are established.

Actions

- Preparation of templates and models, as well as explanatory documents as needed.
- Development of criteria and support tools for environmentalisation.
- Update of existing green procurement guides and development of new green procurement guides.



Indicators

- Type of environmental measure (solvency requirement, award criterion, technical requirement or special execution condition, etc.).

Specific Indicators

Depending on the subject matter of the selected contracts, each department, organisation or entity of the public sector may apply certain specific objectives, for example:

- % of electric vehicles (in the selected contracts).
- % of recycled aggregates (in maintenance services involving road surface work).
- % of recycled raw materials (in the selected contract types).
- % of contracts with food supply clauses for waste prevention.



Lines of Action

Monitoring

This Plan consists of a series of actions aimed at advancing the application of environmental criteria in public procurement optimally.

Several actions have been planned for each line of action. Some of the planned actions are actions that are already carried out within the Administration of the Generalitat de Catalunya and its public sector with positive results, but the Plan systematises and extends them to local public sector entities that wish to adhere. Other actions have been redefined to improve their results, and a final group consists of new actions aimed at enhancing the environmentalisation of public procurement.



5. Methodology for green procurement



Introduction

Environmentalising contracts is a primarily technical action that must be tailored to each contract. However, the following reference resources and general guidelines need to be taken into account:

- The green procurement measures drawn up by the European Commission regarding various categories of products and services (see p. 6 and the consult link).
- The Green Procurement Guidelines of the Generalitat de Catalunya available on the Public Procurement Portal and on this website.

General Guidelines for Incorporating Environmental Award Criteria and Technical Specifications in Public Procurement:

Any award criteria and/or technical specification relating to environmental aspects can be incorporated, including but not limited to:

- a) Energy efficiency and water and resource consumption savings;
- b) Reduced emissions of greenhouse gases, pollutants, particles, dust, noise or radiation;
- c) The use of energy and materials from renewable or recycled sources;
- d) The absence or low presence of toxic or hazardous substances;
- e) The reduced generation of associated waste;
- f) Guarantees of an extended useful life (upgradeability and repairability);
- g) Reusability, recyclability and recycling;
- h) More efficient production using eco-friendly methods and the use of low environmental impact design or eco-design tools; and
- i) any other criteria driven by an environmental programme or policy.

Priority Aspects of Environmentalisation Aligned with Strategic Objectives

The Action Planprioritises improving environmental quality, combating climate change, transitioning to a circular economy, sustainable mobility, biodiversity protection, and energy transition.



Selection of Tenders to be Incorporated into the Plan - Priorities

While green procurement must be general and systematic, the Plan's lines of action include the selection of certain tenders in accordance with the following criteria:

- 1- Contracts related to categories and services defined by the European Commission:
- a) Those that match the contract object, as defined by the European Commission;
- b) Those that, while not matching the contract object, contain an essential element for their implementation that corresponds to a European Commission group (for example contracts that include foods, or that involve the use of vehicles, or require clothing);
- c) Those that match the contractual purposes provided for in point 4 of the Government Agreement, of 11 June 2019, for the promotion of strategic public procurement in the Generalitat de Catalunya and its public sector.
- 2- Contracts that, due to their economic volume, are relevant to the public department, organisation or entity.
- 3- Contracts that, not corresponding to any of the previous situations, are relevant to the public department, organisation or entity because they are characteristic.

Regarding criterion 1-b, there may be a significant quantity and diversity of contracts. The personnel responsible for the Plan will ensure that it is implemented successively, in the most efficient manner.

In any case, the clause documents of framework agreements and centralised procurements will be preferentially selected for environmentalisation purposes.
