

It is evident that the most recent global crises have had an impact on sustainability. The pandemic, for instance, slowed global supply chains, affecting availability of material and several product categories and causing international shortages. This session will explore the effects of the most recent global crises on the public procurement needs. We will take a close look together to find solutions for the day-to-day work of procurers.

The session will explore how mainstreaming public procurement's objectives in an integrated manner throughout each organization, and a reconsideration of public authorities' internal structure could maximize the real impact of Public Procurement.

The session will showcase how policy advocacy can play a relevant role and explore success factors and strategies based on the example of sustainable food procurement, which is one of the target areas of the EU Farm to Fork Strategy. OPTION 1 Visit of Maison des Arts & neighborhood surrounding

The visit will include: visit of the <u>Maison des Arts</u>; and its current Exhibition Color/ Light, and the surrounding area/neighbourhood with an English-speaking Guide.

Description of Maison des Art: From the street, there is nothing to suggest the surprise that awaits you beyond the driveway: an opulent bourgeois residence set in its own gardens. It was built in 1826 for a wealthy linen merchant. The building then passed to Viscount and Viscountess Terlinden, from whose heirs it was later purchased by the Municipality of Schaerbeek. It was subsequently converted into the Maison des Arts/ Kunsthuis, now a centre for contemporary art. The interior has been painstakingly restored. The suite of reception rooms illustrates the varying interpretations of the eclectic style. Since the 1950s, the Maison des Arts/Kunsthuis has hosted a diverse cultural programme of exhibitions with the aim of making contemporary art accessible to all. Artists are regularly invited to take over the space and engage with its decor and history.

OPTION 2 Visit of La Maison Autrique & neighborhood surrounding

The visit will include: visit of the <u>Maison Autrique</u>, and the surrounding area/neighbourhood with an English-speaking Guide.

Description of Maison Autrique: Built in 1893 by the architect Victor Horta for his friend and lodge brother Eugène Autrique, the Maison Autrique marks Victor Horta's debut in a new architectural style that will be called Art Nouveau. Even if it cannot yet be considered a manifesto of Art Nouveau, the Maison Autrique announces the style in some of its constructive principles and decorative details. Having become the property of the Municipality of Schaerbeek, it has undergone an exemplary renovation and is open to the public as a show house of the Belle Epoque. It also hosts exhibitions, the current one being dedicated to the studios of late artists.
